In partnership with a university, businesses can get from £25,000 to £10 million from Innovate UK to fund a research and development programme.

Innovation Vouchers

Innovation Vouchers offer businesses funding (typically £3,000 to £5,000) to work with the University to undertake feasibility studies by tapping in to its facilities, resources and know-how.
